The Navarro County Early Childhood Coalition was formed in January of 2020 to address concerns across the community as a way to work together to move the needle in Navarro County. Research shows that the first five years of a child's life are the most important and most impactful for a child's foundation for life. Early experiences provide the base for the brain's organizational development and functioning throughout life. These experiences also have a direct impact on how children develop learning skills as well as social and emotional abilities. The Navarro County Early Childhood Coalition exists to organize a diverse group of early childhood leaders and stakeholders to turn the curve in regards to safety, health, connection, and school readiness for young children in Navarro County.

#### Our 3 focus areas and desired results:

**Health**-Every child in Navarro County is physically and mentally healthy and has access to care.

**Safety/Connection**-Every child in Navarro County experiences physical and emotional safety and is connected to their caregiver and local resources.

3 School Readiness-Every child in Navarro County is school ready and assisted to meet their full potential

We protect confidentiality


## **Crucial Conversations**

What is Results-Based Accountability?

Our coalition takes a **data-informed approach** to "turning the curve" in our community. We look at local data at each meeting around health, safety, and school readiness to inform the work we do in the community. As we track data, we also identify strategies to change the story in our community. We use Clear Impact's scorecard to record our work and analyze trends in data over time.
